

**BETHEL ASSOCIATED GOSPEL CHURCH OF KINGSTON, ONTARIO**  
**Leadership Community (Congregational) - Annual General Meeting**  
**Tuesday, June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2014**

1. **OPENING PRAYER & REMARKS** - Steve Dickey opened.
2. **DEVOTION THROUGH MUSIC** – Roy Chan led the singing of some songs of worship.
3. **MINUTES** – *Doug Brown motioned to accept the following minutes as printed:*

4. **MINISTRY FOCUS** - Mark Kotchapaw highlighted parts of our Vision Pathway, acknowledging that there are always areas in need of improvement. The following Bethel ministries were highlighted:
  - 4.1 Prayer Ministry** - Rhonda Kotchapaw spoke. Most people are familiar with Bethel's 'After-Service Prayer Team', which offers one-on-one prayer for individuals after the Sunday worship service, as well as prayer for the church. There is also a Prayer Ministry Team whose members have been trained to help hurting individuals uncover the destructive, negative emotional 'lies' they've been living, with the help of the Holy Spirit. They also follow through by discipling those who have gone through the process. This Team includes Mark & Rhonda Kotchapaw, Lyn Stafford, Tracey Thomson, Julie Wight, Jamie Stinson & Sarah Teillet. Lyn and Tracey were present to share what drew them to this ministry and how they have personally benefited.

A new initiative of the Prayer Ministry Team is the development of a 5-week 'small group' curriculum and plans to run a test-group this fall. Julie Wight described the proposed course outline to include:

    - Week 1 - Focuses on our back story; providing tools to spend time with the Lord on your own
    - Week 2 - Identifying individuals that have affected you negatively & positively, and what forgiveness is.
    - Week 3 - What is your story today? Can you trust your own story and see how it plays out in God's plan?
    - Week 4 - Opportunity for ministry
    - Week 5 - Identifying with an authentic 'new' story as God brings healing in your life
  - 4.2 Mentoring** – Bethel's Youth Intern, Anna MacDonald, and Maddie & Roy Chan described their impressions of this exciting ministry initiative that matches a Bethel youth with a mentoring adult. Anna & Maddie shared their story as a mentorship pair & feel they have both grown in intimacy with God through this experience. Roy added how he has seen the benefits of such a program in his daughter's life. Approximately 12 youth have been matched to date.
  - 4.3 Partnership** – Fred Grendel, Bethel's Youth Director, & student, Liam Wilkins, spoke of Bethel's partnership with Camp IAWAH. Four retreats were offered this past year at IAWAH for the Senior High youth. Liam reflected on how these events have helped strengthen his walk with God as well as built relationships with others over the years.
  - 4.4 Prayer Time** – The ministry focus time concluded with a short prayer time in small groups.
